50 years ago


Digital books come onto the scene with Project Gutenberg.

Approximately how much of the daily reading required for your career is done on a screen?


- □ 0 20% (None or very little)

What are some common misconceptions about digital reading?





Myth: Students already have too much screen time. We don't need to expose them to more in school.



FACT: There is a difference between passive and active screen time. Guided screen time benefits students. Most students participate in "shallow" reading (like scrolling through Facebook or Twitter) online.

Deep digital reading in a classroom context enforces good reading habits, making students better at reading and comprehending digital texts. If this practice is not taught purposefully, it's unlikely to be learned.

Myth: Print reading provides better comprehension than reading digitally.



FACT: There is **no notable difference** in comprehension between reading in print and reading digitally.

Reading comprehension is higher in digital texts that use **paging** rather than scrolling. **Reading ebooks is not the same as scrolling online.**

FACT: Studies with middle and high school students show that **digital reading is preferred, especially for boys and reluctant readers**.

Consider that **each student has unique preferences and needs.**

Myth: Audiobooks don't count as "real" reading.



FACT: A meta-analysis shows no discernable difference in comprehension between those who read a book and those who listened to the audiobook.

Additionally, audiobooks provide **support for students** with accessibility needs.


