
THE INHABITANTS OF THE SECRET ANNEX AND THEIR REAL NAMES

Anne Frank was born Annelies Marie in Frankfurt am Main on June 12, 1929, and spent the first years of her life there. In early 1934, Anne lived with her grandmother in Aachen for a few weeks and then joined her family, who had moved to Amsterdam. She attended the Montessori kindergarten, then the Montessori school, and later the Jewish Lyceum. On July 6, 1942, Anne went into hiding in the secret annex with her family. There she was arrested on August 4, 1944, and, shortly afterward, deported via the Westerbork transit camp to Bergen-Belsen, where she died of typhus. The date of her death is believed to be between late February and early March 1945.

Margot Frank, Anne's older sister, was born in Frankfurt am Main on February 16, 1926, and started school there before fleeing to Amsterdam with her mother in 1933. When Margot received a written summons on July 5, 1942, to report for transport to a German labor camp, her parents decided immediately that it was time to move into the hiding place that had been readied months earlier. 





