

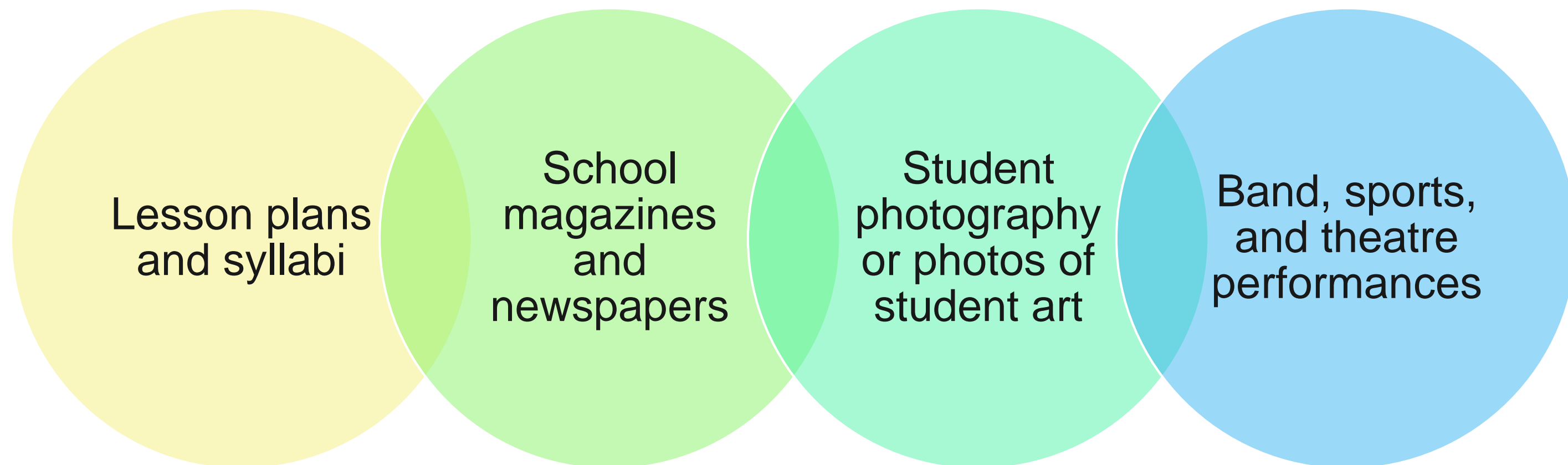
Getting Started with Local Content

What is local content?

A free tool for schools to upload and share content produced by students and faculty.

Note: Content can be uploaded in EPUB, MP3, or WMV formats, and the school must secure rights before publishing.

Local Content

If your organization holds the necessary ownership rights, licenses, and/or permissions to upload and distribute a title, you can add it as local content and circulate it at your OverDrive website.


You can add a new title, edit or delete a previously uploaded title, or add a new format to an existing title (for example, if you uploaded a PDF file, you can upload an EPUB file to the same record).

Number of copies for local content titles

Specify how many copies of each title supplied as local content should be made available at your site. The number of copies set here will be applied to all local content titles uploaded going forward only.

Add a title

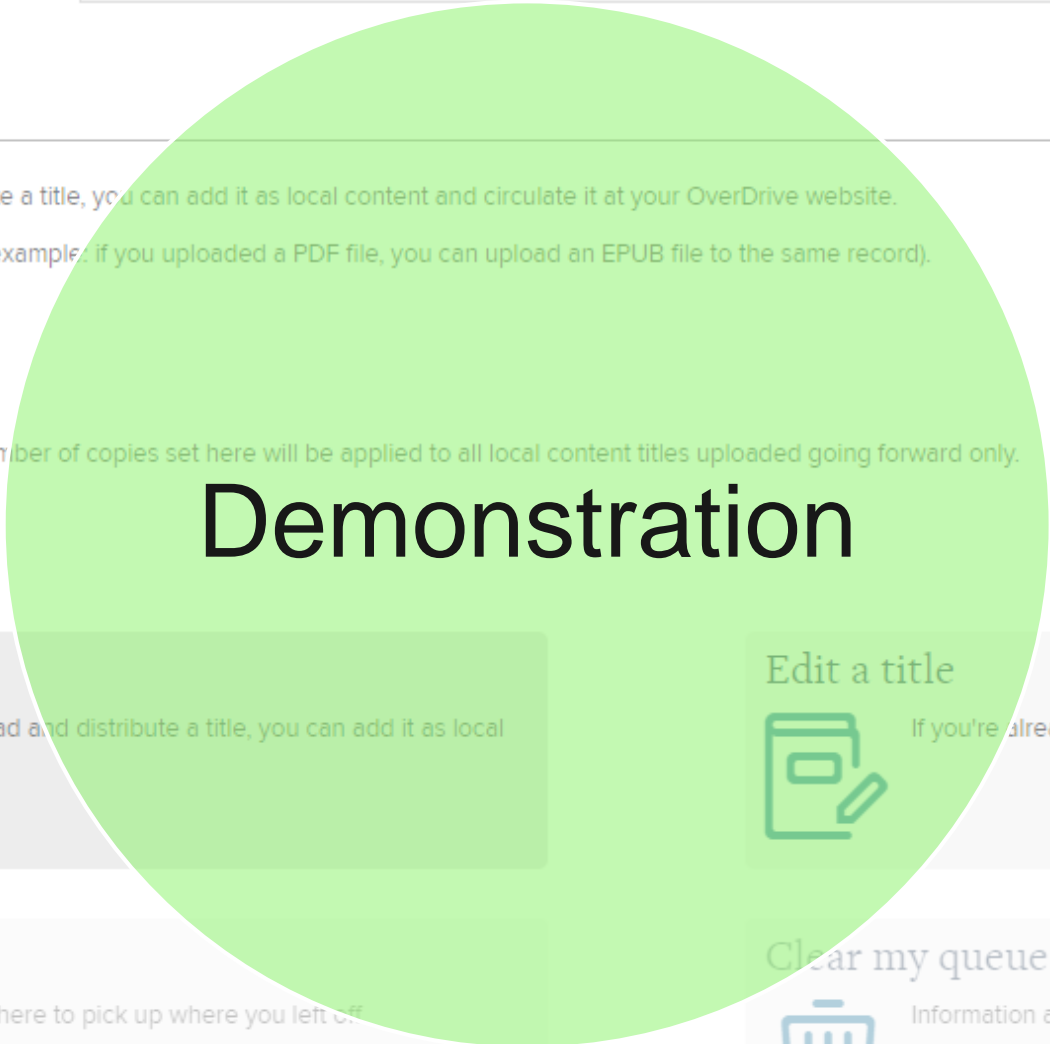

Creating an EPUB file

Select a tool

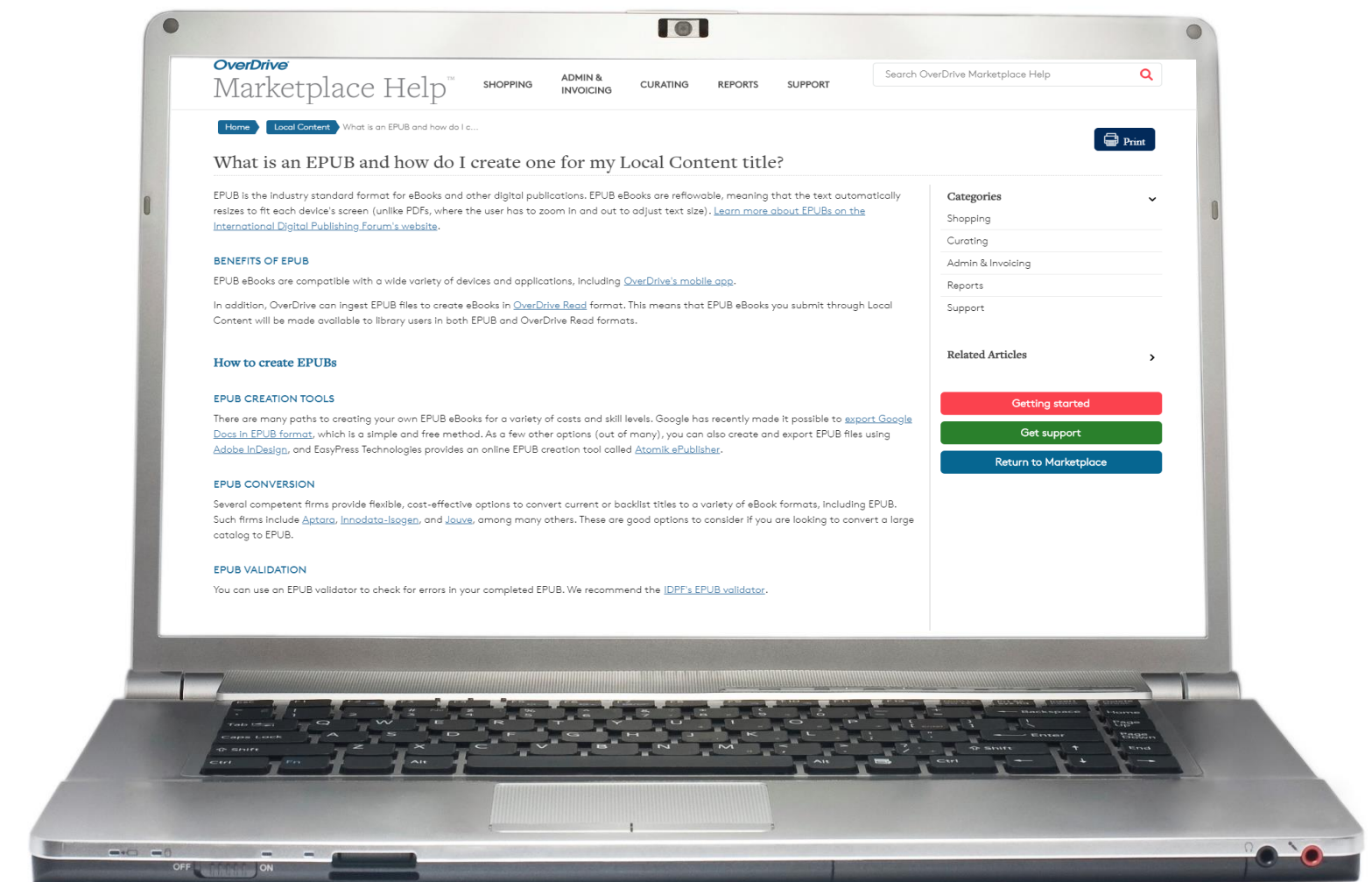
- Export from Google Docs or Adobe InDesign.
- Explore other free or paid options.

Keep it simple

- EPUB is a reflowable format.
- Image heavy documents may be harder to convert.

Double check

- Use an EPUB validator to check for errors.
