Programming Ideas

- **Create a NAIDOC Week feature display**

Pair films from the collection with books by First Nations authors, language resources, and local community information. Include QR codes linking directly to the Kanopy collection for easy access.

- **Host a community screening and discussion**

Screen a selected title (with Public Performance Rights) and facilitate a respectful discussion focused on themes such as culture, history, Country, or storytelling. Where possible, collaborate with local First Nations organisations or educators.

- **Support learning and education programs**

Use selected documentaries to support school programs, lifelong learning, or professional development, particularly around Australian history, cultural understanding, and media literacy.

- **Celebrate First Nations storytelling year-round**

While NAIDOC Week provides a focal point, encourage patrons to explore the collection beyond July, recognising that First Nations histories and cultures are living and ongoing.
