



## **READING GROUP GUIDE**

- 1. There's a growing movement of climate fiction. Would you consider this book cli-fi? Why or why not? What role does fantasy have to offer climate fiction?
- 2. A central part of the story involves Nina's attempts to communicate with her great grandmother. What's a time when you've struggled to communicate with an elder in your community and how did you deal with it?
- **3.** A fictional app called St0ryte11er provides an outlet for Nina and a way for her to tell stories. How does social media affect the way we tell stories?
- 4. What was your favorite chapter of the book? Your least favorite?
- **5.** How does the depiction of animal people compare and contrast to other depictions of shape shifters in popular culture?
- **6.** SNAKE is part of a tradition of Indigenous Futurism. What do you know about this movement and how to you think SNAKE contributes to its goals?
- **7.** What are your thoughts about the dual Point of View? How does that contribute to momentum and tension in the narrative?
- 8. The landscape and natural world (both in the human world and in the reflecting world) have a pivotal role to play in the narrative. How does the setting impact the plot and further the themes of the book?
