


Step-by-step instructions for using the Reading Response Journal

- 1. Create a free teacher account or <u>log into your Book Creator teacher account</u>. Learn more about the different account types <u>here</u>.
- 2. Create a new library for your class and change the settings to ensure students have a safe place to work.

To do this, go to the <u>Teacher Dashboard</u> (click the icon top-left of the toolbar) then choose **Create a new library.**




3. Give the library a name and apply the settings that best match your needs. Library settings can always be changed later.

Finally, select **Create library** and you're all set to remix the Sora Reading Response Journal! <u>Learn more about managing Book Creator libraries.</u>




4. Remix the book template into your new library.



Select your library and choose **Copy to Library** to add the book.



6. Invite students and other teachers to join the library.


Navigate back to your created library and select "Show invite code for others to join".
