What is Sora?



- Sora is an Overdrive product
- It provides ebooks and audiobooks for school libraries
- It is designed for student/school use
- Libraries have the ability to set user content access levels
- Very similar to the Libby app you may have used with your public library





More about Sora

- The app itself is FREE- you only pay for content
- Librarian selects which books to purchase to add to the collection
- Publishers determine how books can be purchased/lending models
- Recommend a point person/main admin at your school or district to take the lead with Sora


Some great Sora features- Users

Users can control:

- Display in high contrast
- Dyslexic font feature
- Some titles are available as read along with both text and audio
- Audiobooks are read by a human voice, frequently by skilled voice actors or the author, to be engaging while listening
- Users may adjust the audiobook playback speed in audiobooks and font size in ebooks
- Users may connect to various other libraries including Audiobook Sync
- Achievement badges that keep track of completed reading and a timer that counts how long you have used the app



Unique Use: Sports Team Read



- Our Boys Basketball team used a Sora audiobook for a team read.
- We were able to buy 100 copies of the audiobook so they could all use it at the same time.
- Used title assignment to check out the book to each player and coach, and they did a book study together.
 - Title Assignments can save copies in Metered Access format
- We still have several copies left over and other schools have shown interest in doing the same thing with their team.

Promoting Sora District Wide



- When we opened the collection in 2020, we did lots of hype leading up to the release
 - <u>Sora Designed Marketing Kit</u>
- Shared reading challenge across the district like the "Reading Without Walls" Challenge by Gene Luen Yang
 - Learn more about the <u>Reading Without Walls challenge</u>
 - We included "Read a book in Sora" or "Listen to an Audiobook in Sora" to the challenge or included ebook or audiobook in the format category.
- Reminding teachers about Sora has been very effective too. Teachers who use Sora will talk to their students about it
- Friends of the library groups and book club groups in Schoology
- Collaboration with our Public Librarians who are more familiar with Libby



Funding

- Site based money from our county
 - We are advocating for a small amount to be automatically put into Sora each year before it reaches the schools
- Remind librarians when their budgets are released with data about Sora usage at their school
 - Then a follow up reminder about a month before final requisitions must be submitted in case anyone has with any leftover money
 - A little here and a little there really can add up and it's nice that the money stays in Sora versus if it stayed in our school budget it would just disappear!
- Use your data to highlight needs.
 - Principals love data and students reading!
 - Sora staff is happy to help you with understand the numbers in your school or district.
