

SORA SPOTLIGHT: The Delaware Accelerate Learning Collection

How a state-level collection can foster digital reading success

In 2021, the Delaware Department of Education set a new challenge for itself: Shift the narrative from pandemic-related learning loss to learning acceleration, by giving students and staff across the state access to the resources needed to eliminate barriers to reading.

To achieve this goal, the DDOE turned to the Sora platform, leveraging federal Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds to establish the Delaware Accelerate Learning Collection, a shared statewide ebook and audiobook collection available to all public schools across Delaware. The digital collection includes:


- Popular ebooks, audiobooks, comics and magazines
- Authentic and translated texts in languages other than English
- High-quality curriculum books adopted by each of Delaware's local education agencies


BY THE NUMBERS: THE DELAWARE ACCELERATE LEARNING COLLECTION

Several years on, the numbers tell the story of the collection's success: Delaware Accelerate Learn- ing surpassed one million checkouts in 2023, and median and average student reading time have all increased not only year-over-year, but semester-over-semester (in 2023-2024).

One-third of Sora users read at least an hour more in the second semester of the 2023-2024 school year than in the first semester.
